



Have You Filed Your Personal Tax Return?

(For Individuals Receiving Employment Income)



The deadline for filing your personal tax return is 30 April 2020 for employment income received in the year 2019. However, in consideration of the Movement Control Order (MCO), a 2 months grace period has been granted by the Inland Revenue Board (IRB) for the submission of tax return until **30 June 2020**.

FAQs on Filing Personal Tax Return

Am I required to file my tax return?

If your total employment income for the year 2019 is more than **RM34,000** after EPF deductions, you will have to file for your tax return. But first, you will have to register with IRB to obtain your Income Tax Reference Number.



How do I know whether my employment income for the year 2019 is more than RM34,000?

Just refer to your EA Form to check your employment income earned in the year 2019.

How do I file my tax return?

Visit <https://ez.hasil.gov.my/CI/> and after logging in, select e-BE for the year of assessment (YA) 2019. And viola – start filing your taxes! Having all the documents ready by your side including your EA Form, your donation receipts, etc. will help speed up the whole process!

How do I register with IRB to obtain my Income Tax Reference Number?

Visit IRB's website at <http://www.hasil.gov.my/> to register your Income Tax File.

Select e-Daftar, fill in the form and upload a copy of your Identification Card.

Upon receiving the approval, head over to your nearest IRB branch to obtain your PIN number to register for e-filing.

Alternatively, during the MCO period, taxpayers may apply for e-Filing PIN number through: Customer Feedback Form available at IRB's Official Portal at

Income tax relief – what's new?

Previously, individuals can claim up to a maximum of RM6,000 for both life insurance and EPF relief combined. From YA 2019 onwards, an individual can claim for life insurance and EPF relief separately for up to a maximum of RM3,000 and RM4,000 respectively.

What if I forget to file my tax return?

Failure to file your tax return may result in a penalty ranging from RM200 to RM20,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or to both (on conviction);

OR

Up to 300% of tax payable (if no prosecution).

How do I start if I am a first timer in e-Filing?

Upon obtaining your PIN number from IRB, visit <https://ez.hasil.gov.my/CI/> and select First Time Login. Follow the steps to complete your First Time login.



So, remember to file your tax return on time!
